A cool upper trough will persist over the province for the next few days. Airmass instability will lead to the possibility of a brief flurry Sunday afternoon. On Monday a dryer NE flow aloft will give a mix of sun and cloud. Winds will be generally light from the north. Temperatures continue on the cool side for this time of year with highs on the slopes near -5 C.
